## Parking decals will expire at midnight on August 31. Have you purchased a new one?

Parking decals can be purchased in person at the Parking Division, located in the lower level of Trueblood Hall. There is temporary parking for Parking Division visitors located on Logan Dr, east of Trueblood Hall. The entrance to the Parking Division is on the east side of the building.

Why get out in the heat or come to work early to buy your decal when you can purchase it online. Decals can now be purchased online with a small additional fee of \$3.54. Once purchased, you will be given a link to print a temporary parking permit. Your decal will be mailed to the address you provided usually within 5 business days.



## **Community Resource Officers**

In accordance with the chancellor's strategic initiatives outlined in "Pathways to Excellence: A Strategic Plan," as well as the SIU Department of Public Safety's proactive, community-oriented and community-involved policing philosophy, University Housing and DPS continue to collaborate and coordinate services to resolve community issues impacting the safety and security of University Housing student residents, guests and staff. This cooperative effort is intended to improve the overall quality of life across University Housing residence halls, programming spaces and dining facilities. Together, the Department of Public Safety and University Housing have dedicated two police officers to University Housing facilities. These officers, known as community resource officers (CROs), provide an open and ongoing channel of communication between the various University Housing communities and the Department of Public Safety.

to build relationships between students and the police.


The police liaison program was initiated to promote the safety of students and staff in addition to enhancing the quality of life in the residence halls through the presentation of safety programs and the involvement of officers on a more constant and intense level. The program provides an open and ongoing channel of communication between residents of University Housing and police. Police officers assigned to the police liaison program attend housing staff meetings, coordinate special presentations and provide relevant safety information to members of the community.

The liaison officers will seek information and input from housing staff as to the specific and varying needs of each housing area, working to achieve solutions that make for a positive living and learning atmosphere. Liaison officers and housing staff communicate regularly in addition to normal patrol functions within their respective areas. This communication and interaction allows the officers to get involved with more of the residents and learn about their specific needs. This allows officers to better suit the needs of the day-to-day activities in each community. Liaison officers and assigned building locations are still being developed. ## SOUTHERN ILLINOIS PLANE PULL

Special Olympics Illinois and the Law Enforcement Torch Run have partnered with the Southern Illinois University School of Aviation and the Department of Public Safety to host the inaugural Southern Illinois Plane Pull on September 24, 2016 at the Southern Illinois Airport in Murphysboro, IL. The Plane Pull features the ultimate man versus machine battle as teams of up to 8 play tug-of-war with SIU Aviation's 737, weighing nearly 60,000 lbs. That's right, the plane weighs nearly 30 tons!

Each participant must raise a minimum of \$50 and teams can have up to 8 members (\$400 for a team of 8). Teams will compete by pulling the aircraft 12 feet as quickly as possible. Awards are given to the fastest pull in each division, fastest pull overall, top fundraiser and top fundraising team.

All proceeds collected through the Plane Pull benefit the more than 22,000 traditional athletes and more than 20,000 Young Athletes (ages 2-7) currently participating with Special Olympics Illinois.

## The Rave Mobile Alert System

RAVE is used to send emergency text messages to cellphones and to campus email addresses of students, faculty and staff. The message may alert you to an emergency situation, including university closures and safety alerts. The system provides weather warnings, including severe thunderstorm, tornado, flash flood, and winter storm.

To receive emergency text messages, students must have current contact information in <u>SalukiNet</u>.





## **Campus Safety Tips**

- Lock your doors
